

# Remembering the 2010 Liège Astrophysical Colloquium...



gluing),...






... check their e-mail, or try to figure out their way to the restaurant themselves.

After lunch, we are back to science and we learn more about X-rays, X-rays, X-rays and guess what... radio data!






Some people really tell us
